Remembering The Reformation

John Wycliffe (1328 AD – 1384 AD) is responsible for translating the Latin Bible into the English language. He and his followers denounced the temporal authority of church and state in favor of scriptures. Wycliffe promoted the teachings of scripture instead of religious tradition. He condemned the doctrines of Transubstantiation, monasticism, clergy celibacy, and the Pope. Wycliffe believed in pre-destination, the destruction of idols, and the non-separation of church and state. He was excommunicated from the church after his death.
